

Bennett Hall Railroad Station

Bennett Hall, Billerica, MA Terminal Division On Lexington Branch MP 20.69 from Boston. This section north of Bedford was commonly known as the "B&B" or Bedford & Billerica after the original 2 foot gauge line built between those towns circa 1870.

Middlesex, Lowell, MA

Engine House and Turntable built in 1920 at MP 27.28 from Boston.

1.7 miles north of Lowell on the New Hampshire Division.

On original Nashua and Lowell Railroad. Circa 1838

Was not a passenger stop.

As for the Middlesex Sign was found by the New Hampshire Main line in 1969. Mounted by 2 bolts on a leaning wood or concrete post.

The sign was from eastern/southern end of the Middlesex engine house lead.

Station on so-called "Loop" through town center just west of original Boston & Lowell main line of 1835. MP 9.96 from Boston.




Winchester, MA New Hampshire Division On original Boston & Lowell Railroad of 1835. MP 7.82 from Boston.

Salem N.H. Railroad Station

The Salem Depot was built in 1867 represents the town rail center. On the original Manchester & Lawrence Railroad, circa 1840 and later the Boston & Maine Railroad The Salem N.H. Station located on the Manchester & Lawrence Branch, part of the Portland Division. MP 32.97 from Boston.

Mt Tom MA. Fitchburg Division/Conn River Line MP 14.72 from Springfield, MA On Original Conn River Railroad circa 1845.

Woodmere Railroad Whistle Stop

Woodmere, Rindge, N.H. Fitchburg Division. On the Worcester Branch, MP 43.49 from Worcester, between Winchendon, MA and Peterboro, N.H. Named Sunshine Lake pre-1908.

Schaghticoke Railroad Station

Schaghticoke New York Fitchburg Division On original Troy & Boston line { which reached no further east than North Adams in 1859 } MP 177.99 from Boston.

West Hollis Railroad Station

West Hollis, New Hampshire Fitchburg Division On original Worcester, Nashua & Portland Circa 1870. MP 11.68 from Ayer, MA.

Hubbardston Station

Hubbardston, MA: Fitchburg Division. MP 20.03 from Worcester on the Peterboro, later Gardner, Branch. Originally on the Boston, Barre & Gardner Railroad circa 1874.

Whately Station

Whately, MA: Fitchburg Division / Conn River Line. MP 26.15 from Springfield. On original Conn River Railroad circa 1845.

Danville Junction Station

Danville Junction: Located between Lewiston & Waterville, Maine. On Maine Central Railroad. Where the Maine Central & Grand Trunk & Canadian National's Portland –Montreal Line crossed.

Sterling Junction Station

Sterling Junction 34 miles from Nashua, and 12 miles from Worcester, on the Worcester and Nashua Railroad.

The Fitchburg & Worcester Railroad branches off here from Fitchburg.

Riverhill Station

Riverhill New Hampshire

The portion of the Concord & Claremont that this depot was located on was abandoned by the Boston & Maine Railroad in 1960 due to a flood control project that would have resulted in a costly relocation of the rail line. The station once stood at the railroad crossing on Carter Hill Road. The Station sign is approximately 11" high and about 61" long.

Penacook Station

Penacook New Hampshire Penacook is on the line of the Boston & Maine Railroad, Concord Division, it being the first station north of Concord, and about seven miles from the capital.

The station sign is approximately 11" high and 55" long.
