BOSTON & MAINE RAILROAD: Set of train numbers which were mounted on a rod in front of the locomotive headlight to denote the number of the train. (Not the locomotive). Used in the 1885 to 1925 period. Use discontinued in 1925.

Railroad Headlights, by the time of the Civil War, the headlamps became standard.

The headlamps became smaller and rounder.

Engine numbers were stamped out of metal and covered with glass.

These spaces served to donate the number of the Train.

Pyle-National Classification Lamp

- Classification Lamps / Mounted on the sides of the Locomotive.
- They had three settings, Off, White, and Green.
- The green signal was achieved by turning a lever that would move green glass discs between the light source and the clear lens.
- Regularly scheduled trains would show dark (i. e off) classification lamp.
- Trains run as extra would show white classification lamps.
- If a train was split up into more than one section, the preceding sections would show green classification lamps with the last section having an unlit lamp.



3 Chime Steam Whistle

The Steam Locomotive whistle was perhaps the single most recognizable piece of hardware on the railroad, both by its appearance and by the melodic-sometimes even mournful-chant it sang out with.

This particular whistle rod atop the boiler of a Boston & Maine 4100-class 'Mountain' engine, for years playing its mellow tone across the hills and valleys of New England.

Fell through the River Bridge at Portsmouth New Hampshire 9/10/1939. Never recovered.


Parts of the locomotive were salvaged at low tide in the 1960's.




